### **Unselfish Act Receives Recognition**


Alex Toll was working his regular shift at the Sonic in Lowell on a Sunday night when he heard a distressed co-worker calling his name. She had just witnessed a terrible car accident in front of the restaurant and he ran out front to see a single vehicle on fire on the opposite side of Highway 71 B.

Without a second thought for his own safety, Alex rushed across the busy roadway to see if he could help. Quickly scanning the scene, he could see that the single occupant was pinned inside the vehicle but he was unconscious and unable to free himself. As the fire began spreading quickly, Alex tried the doors but they wouldn't open. With adrenaline-fueled strength, he mustered all his energy and soon pulled the door open with his bare hands enough to get the man out. He tried to unbuckle the man's seat belt but it had become jammed and wouldn't budge. As the flames inched closer, Alex ripped out the seat belt and began pulling the man out but was confronted by another obstacle; the man's leg was pinned under the car's dashboard.

While another Good Samaritan held the unresponsive man upright, Alex worked quickly and carefully to free the man's leg so they could get him to safety. Believing the car might explode at any moment and, with the help of a few other bystanders, they were finally able to pull the injured man about 75 yards away from the car – now almost totally engulfed in flames.

Thankfully, one of the others had some first aid training and proceeded to offer assistance until rescue arrive. Once the ambulance was on scene and the man was attended to, police officers asked Alex and the others for statements about what happened. When asked why he ran to help without consideration for his own safety, his answer was something his late grandfather had instilled in him from an early age: "We continue forward in the hopes that our lives in the future are brighter not just for ourselves, but for everyone. If you see you can make a difference, DO SO!"

Alex Toll was recognized for his unselfish act of bravery by the Mayor at the Lowell City Council meeting on September 19, 2017.





The Lowell Fire Department applied for financial assistance through the Department of Homeland Security for the Fiscal Year of 2016. The Grant is called Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) and was awarded to our department on August 18, 2017. The SAFER Grant provides financial help of hiring 12 additional firefighters for the Lowell Fire Department. This Grant will be for three years providing 75% of the cost of salary and fringe benefits the first two years and 35% the third year of the hired personnel. The Federal share will be \$1,117,700.00 and the City of Lowell's share will be \$694,830.00. This will greatly help with expenses to our budget due to the building of our new fire station #2 and the recent addition of our ambulance service to the citizens of Lowell. The additional firefighters will help maintain our ISO (insurance service offices) rating and the growing demand to protect our firefighter safety, citizens safety and property conservation and the completion of station #2 in March of 2018. We have a current ISO rating of 3 that is rated from a scale of 1-10 due to training, personnel, water supply, apparatus and several other factors. The lower the rating the lower the charge for commercial and residential insurance. Thank you Nolan Jones, Division Chief, for your hard work and persistence on this grant.
