

DID YOU KNOW, that as of June 18,2019 the keeping of chickens (hens) in certain locations, is allowable within the City limits of Lowell? Ordinance No. 1037 spells out the specifics of what is required and the number allowed. Keep yard waste from entering our ponds and streams

The worst way to manage fall leaves is to rake, sweep or blow the fallen leaves out into the street. Leaves that end up on the streets can clog storm drains. These leaves eventually work their way into our streams. As they breakdown they release nutrients which contribute to lower water quality, cause algae blooms which can lead to fish kills and unpleasant views of nature.

As the leaves start to fall, give mulch mowing a try. It really is not that much work because the mower does the work for you.
