

And Ask!

If you are not sure that your project requires a permit, then call the inspector and ask. Laws and regulations can change from time to time and it is your responsibility to make yourself aware of the ones that will apply to you and your situation. Several things that did not require permits in the past may now require them. Permits and inspections do not necessarily mean that the job is going to cost more. What it does mean is that the work will be done to current codes. If you fail to obtain proper permits for your work it may keep you from being able to sell your home or affect an insurance claim, if a loss were to happen.
